

July Guest Preachers

Tom Sauer, ruling elder, will be leading worship with us on July 14.

Tom was born and raised in Ohio. He has degrees in chemistry, zoology, and engineering. In 1992, Tom accepted a position with International Paper, and the family moved to Germantown.

A lifelong Presbyterian, Tom has served on various congregational and Presbytery committees and offices, including deacon, elder, clerk of session, and, more recently, as Moderator of the Presbytery.

In 2011, after 18 months of study and examination, Tom was commissioned by the Presbytery of the MidSouth to lead worship at the LaGrange Presbyterian Church, a service which lasted nine years.

In 2013, Tom retired from International Paper and was commissioned to also serve the Germantown Presbyterian Church as minister to senior adults; in this position, he visits senior members who find themselves homebound or in the hospital and also leads worship from time to time.

Tom served Farmington Presbyterian last year during Rev. Luter's sabbatical, and he is excited to return to worship with us.

Tom and his wife, Kim have 2 children and 5 grandchildren, all of whom live in the area. Tom and Kim are members of Germantown Presbyterian Church.





On July 21, Rev. Ruth Lovell Bradham will be guest preaching for us.

She served as our Associate Pastor from 2001–2006. Along with her husband and mother, both FPC members, Ruth has been a part of the Farmington family once again since 2017 and lives here in Germantown.

Rev. Ruth, as she was affectionately called during her ministry here, is a lifelong member of our Presbytery. Raised at Highland Heights, she was an active participant in the Presbytery's Youth leadership both as a youth and later as a young adult. She was on staff at Camp Pinecrest for many summers and represented our Presbytery as Youth Advisory Delegate to the PC(USA) General Assembly in 1994.

While earning her undergraduate degree in College Scholars from UT Knoxville in child and family studies, psychology and religion she considered the Presbyterian Student Center on campus (now UKirk) her home away from home. A graduate of Columbia Theological Seminary, she worked with several Atlanta area congregations during seminary. Ruth has also served on various Presbytery Committees, led youth ministry for Grace and Shady Grove Presbyterian, guest preached in numerous pulpits and served as Pastor of Cordova Presbyterian Church.

In between Ruth's ministries here and Cordova she was Manager of Family Care for our community's organ and tissue procurement organization, offering crisis and grief counseling to potential donor families at the time of their loved one's death. She holds a certificate in Grief and Loss from the Center for Loss and Colorado State University and has been named a Certified Thanatologist by The Association for Death Education Counseling. Companioning others in grief is one of her greatest passions in ministry.


Blessing of the Backpacks August 11 during Worship
