#### Deepening Our Discipleship

This morning as I walked down the hall of Farmington, I met a preschool class going outside to gather fall leaves. This time of year makes me think of pumpkin spice and campfires with roasted marshmallows, of harvest and hayrides under blankets, of caramel apples and stewardship. #### **Youth Sunday School**


Students in 6th-12th grades will have Sunday School from 10am-10:45am in the Youth Room on Sunday mornings.

The youth will choose what they will study at their Pizza Party Kick-off Event on Sept. 8th.


#### **Sunday School for Adults**
