Session Report

The November and December 2024 Financial Reports were accepted and the church budget for 2025 adopted. Session approved renewing our annual church pledge for \$17,500 to support the ministries of the Presbytery. A Congregational Meeting has been called following worship on Sunday, February 16, for the purposes of receiving the 2024 Annual Report, considering Pastor Terms of Call for 2025, and electing the 2025 Nominating Committee. Session approved a motion to nominate Paula Gale (chair) and Jinney Hart (ruling elder) to serve as the Ruling Elders on the 2025 Nominating Committee. Session approved an additional \$2,000 for the refurbishment of the Outdoor Nativity figures. A motion to contract with Hord Architects for roof replacement services was discussed and tabled, additional information will be requested. Session approved BSA Troop 368's request to hold a lock-in on February 7-9, 2025. Session approved the baptism of Mary Wells Caldwell (December 16 -December 18, 2024), infant daughter of Mandy Caldwell by Rev. Rebecca Luter on December 17, 2024, at LeBonheur NICU.

Associate Pastor Nominating Committee




The Associate Pastor Nominating Committee meets on Tuesday nights, either in person or virtually.

The Cottage at Germantown United Methodist Church

We host Room in the Inn on the 3rd Saturday each month at The Cottage at Germantown United Methodist Church. This ministry provides housing for homeless persons. Each time we host, a group of people prepare a meal for the evening: a casserole or meat, side(s), salad, bread, and dessert. The meal should serve 22 adults. A group of 6-8 people host our guests by setting up at 5pm and welcoming the guests at 6pm. We eat together and visit or play games until 9:30pm. At 9pm, 2 overnight shepherds arrive to spend the night, prepare coffee and a to-go breakfast, and do light clean-up after the guests depart at 6am. After we host, 2 laundry angels volunteer to launder the sheets, pillow cases, and blankets after we host our guests. This is a great way for someone who cannot be there in the evenings to still be a part of this ministry. The sign-up is on the website.
